# Travel to Durham

# By road

Durham city centre is only two miles from the A1(M). Leave the motorway at Junction 62 on the A690 Durham - Sunderland road and follow signs to Durham City Centre.

Durham is 264 miles from London, 187 miles from Birmingham, 125 miles from Edinburgh and 67 miles from York.

There are several express coach services daily from most major cities. Durham is well served by both regional express services and the local bus network. From the city bus station - a short walk from the railway station - a bus service runs every 15 minutes past the Colleges on South Road.

There are approximately 80 parking spaces available at Collingwood College on a first-come firstserved basis. You will need to register your car with the college reception upon arrival. If extra parking space is required, staff will be on had to direct people to the overflow parking.

# By rail

60 InterCity trains from most major centres in the country call at Durham daily including 14 trains from London. The GNER high speed service takes under 3 hours from London King's Cross on the main East Coast line.

Durham is just over 3 hours from Birmingham, 2½ hours from Manchester, 1½ hours from Edinburgh and 45 minutes from York.

A taxi will take you from the station to any College within 5 minutes.

# By air

Durham is 30 minutes drive from Newcastle Airport (<u>http://www.northumberland.gov.uk/vg/tair.html</u>) and about 40 minutes from Durham Tees Valley (<u>http://www.durhamteesvalleyairport.com/index.php</u>). Both have regular domestic and international flights. Durham is linked to Newcastle Airport by rail and metro. Travellers into Durham Tees Valley can take advantage of the free Sky Express bus service that links the airport to Darlington railway station, with regular connections to Durham.
