The Chair of the British Dam Society (BDS) and the Reservoir Safety Research Advisory Group (ReSRAG), Alan Warren, would like to invite you to a workshop focusing on reservoir safety research and development (R&D).

An opportunity to hear and share the latest reservoir safety R&D across government¹, industry and academia; meeting with many of the leading experts in the field. At the cutting edge of research, your views on these developments are important to us. We will focus on opportunities to support or collaborate on R&D, helping to improve and maintain the safety of UK reservoirs.

The workshop is aimed at academics and researchers who are currently engaged in fields relating to reservoir safety, alongside affiliated institutions such as research councils.

The event will run from 10.30am to 3:00pm on the 16th June 2020 in Solihull² Lunch and refreshments will be provided.

What will the workshop cover?

The workshop will include an update from the joint (Defra, Welsh Government, Natural Resources Wales, Environment Agency) Flood and Coastal Risk Management (FCERM) R&D programme, an overview of a wide range of research it's connected with, and an explanation of the role of the British Dam Society and ReSRAG. It will provide an opportunity to meet some of the leading Industry experts in this area and interlink priorities. It will be an opportunity to;

- explore current and developing research that could lead to future developments, helping identify priorities for future R&D work in relation to reservoir design, construction, operation and maintenance.
- hear from leading Industry experts and consider future networks
- gain an overview of nationwide current research in your field of work.
- raise awareness of your own research and opportunities for collaboration.
